

Figure 1-2 Percentages of female registered candidates of Civil Service Examinations by type (2013-2017)




Figure 1-3 Examination attendance rate of Civil Service Examinations by type (2017)

Figure 1-4 Examination attendance rate of Civil Service Examinations by type (2013-2017)





Figure 1-5 Percentages of qualified examinees of Civil Service Examinations by type (2017)

Figure 1-6 Qualification rate of Civil Service Examinations by type (2013-2017)



Figure 1-8 Percentages of registered candidates of technicians in Civil Service Examinations by type (2013-2017)





Figure 1-9 Percentages of qualified examinees of administrative personnel in Civil Service Examinations by type (2013-2017)

Figure 1-10 Percentages of qualified examinees of technicians in Civil Service Examinations by type (2013-2017)






Figure 1-11 Qualification rate of administrative personnel in Civil Service Examinations by type (2013-2017)





Figure 1-14 Percentages of qualified examinees of Special Civil Service Examinations by examination name (2013-2017)






Figure 1-15 Gender Disparity in the percentages of qualified examinees of Special Civil Service Examinations in select examination names (2013-2017)





Figure 2-2 Percentages of registered candidates and qualified examinees of Senior Professional and Technical Examinations by category (2017)






Figure 2-3 Percentages of registered candidates and qualified examinees of Junior Professional and Technical Examinations (2017)






Figure 2-4 Percentages of registered candidates and qualified examinees of Junior Professional and Technical Examinations by category (2017)

Figure 3-2 Percentages of female civil servants by agency (end of 2013-2017)




Figure 3-3 Percentages of female civil servants by county(city) (end of 2017)




Figure 3-4 Percentages of level of education of civil servants (end of 2017)




Figure 3-5 Percentages of civil servants by rank (end of 2017)




Figure 3-6 Percentages of female civil servants by rank (end of 2013-2017)




Figure 3-7 Percentages of civil servants by age (end of 2017)




Figure 3-8 Percentages of civil servants as supervisors (end of 2016)




Figure 3-9 Percentages of indigenous civil servants by personnel category (end of 2017)




Figure 3-10 Percentages of disabled civil servants by personnel category (end of 2017)





Figure 3-11 Civil servants applying for parental leave without pay and restoration (2013-2017)



Figure 3-12 Percentages of civil servants applying for parental leave without pay and restoration by the period of leave (2017)





Figure 4-1 Percentages of screening and review results of civil servants performance evaluation by gender (2016)





Figure 4-5 Number of civil servants receiving Distinguished Achievement Award by agency (2017)




Figure 4-6 Number of civil servants receiving Distinguished Achievement Award by rank (2017)




Figure 4-7 Percentages of civil servants receiving Model Civil Servants Award by agency (2017)





Figure 4-8 Percentages of civil servants receiving Model Civil Servants Award by rank (2017)



Figure 5-2 Percentages of retaining training qualification for Elementary, Junior and Senior Civil Service Exam qualifiers (2013-2017)





Figure 5-3 Qualification rate of training for Civil Service Exam and Special Civil Service Exam qualifiers (2013-2017)

Figure 5-4 Percentages of on-the-job training for civil servants by rank (2013-2017)





Figure 5-5 The average of on-the-job training hours for civil servants by rank (2013-2017)

Figure 5-6 Percentages of promotion training by type (2017)




Figure 5-7 Percentages of promotion training by type (2013-2017)




Figure 5-8 Qualification rate of Junior to Senior rank promotion training and Elementary to Junior rank promotion training (2013-2017)




Figure 5-9 Qualification rate of Junior to Senior rank promotion training of Police Officers and Elementary to Junior rank promotion training of Police Officers (2013-2017)




Figure 5-10 Percentages of developing training for Senior civil servants (2013-2017)





Figure 5-11 Percentages of developing training for Senior civil servants by type (2017)




Figure 5-12 Percentages of counsellor of training for Civil Service Exam and Special Civil Service Exam qualifiers (2013~2017)





Junior to Senior Rank Promotion Training




Elementary to Junior Rank Promotion Training



Figure 6-1 Overview of civil servants retirement review by type (2017)





Figure 6-2 Percentages of civil servants retirement review by rank (2017)





Figure 6-3 Average age of civil servants retirement review by rank (2017)





Figure 6-4 Number of civil servants voluntary retirement review by age (2017)






Figure 6-6 Percentages of civil servants survivor relief review by age (2017)



Figure 7-1 Overview of employees of Examination Yuan and subordinate agencies by gender (end of 2017)





Figure 7-2 Percentages of personnel of Examination Yuan and subordinate agencies by agency (end of 2017)




